"Southeast" and Pius X King's was at 40th & South; "East" King's was at 66th & O streets; "Lincoln High" King's was at 19th & O and "Northeast" King's was a few blocks north of Cotner and Vine.

During the summer, Janie also spent a lot of time at Hillcrest Country Club swimming pool, or she might go with friends to a Lincoln Municipal pool. I didn't go to swimming pools very often since I couldn't swim! Instead, I went fishing or played golf.

The year 1968 was an incredible year for rock and roll music. The summer of 1968 really exploded with new, different and exciting entertainment. In July of 1968, the Beatles' psychedelic animated film "Yellow Submarine" was released in London. There were a number of unusual, fascinating, songs released in July of 1968, all of which we sang and danced to. It included:

**Hello, I love you**, The Doors

**Jumpin' Jack Flash**, The Rolling Stones

**Born to Be Wild**, Steppenwolf (I thought this song was about me!)

**Hurdy Gurdy Man**, Donovan

**Think**, Aretha Franklin

**Piece of My Heart**, Big Brother and the Holding Company

As you know, the summer of 1968 also saw significant activities related to the Vietnam War. Pediatrician and well-known anti-war activist, Dr. Benjamin Spock, was sentenced to two years in prison for conspiring to help men evade the draft.

1968 also included further expansion of women's rights including more women involved in various sporting activities. All of this included tennis star Billie Jean King winning the women's singles title at the 75th Wimbledon tennis tournament in London. It was King's third singles crown at Wimbledon, and she went on to win a record 20 total Wimbledon championships during her career. I never did play tennis. I preferred racquetball.


